
Thematic Priorities

Overall goal of SDC's cooperation is to improve the health status of the population with a special focus on poor and vulnerable groups.







Level of Investment in Health (2013)

- Total investments of SDC in Health: CHF 149 mio.
- Multilateral (20%): 30 Mio., thereof GFATM (10 Mio.); WHO (5.5 Mio.); UNAIDS (10 Mio.), UNFPA (5 Mio)
- Bilateral (71%): CHF **106** Mio., thereof: 85 Mio. in the South, 21 Mio. in the East
- Humanitarian Aid (9%): 13 Mio. UN-System, CH and int. NGOs




Type of Investments in 2013








 - Monitoring: Periodic review mechanism




























