



## 2. Getting the definitions clear



- **Stigma is the result of a process in which five interrelated components combine to generate stigma** (Link B. G. and Phelan J.C., 2006)
  1. People identifying and labelling human differences (social selection process)
  2. Process of stereotyping
  3. Separation: « us » and « them »
  4. Discrimination and loss of status
  5. Exercise of power



- **Strong link between stigma and discrimination**
  1. Direct discrimination
  2. Structural discrimination
  3. Insidious forms of discrimination (self-stigmatisation)



- **Stigma processes**
  - Often unrecognised
  - Enormous impact on people's lives
  - Negatively affect access to medical care and life chances
  - Source of chronic stress



- **Stigma and health**
    - Disease-specific and **culture-specific**
    - Reflects social and cultural values and differences in health programmes and **health staff behaviour**
    - Strong **barrier** to treatment and treatment adherence
- 



- Stigma is a potent form of **social control**
- Stigma is a major cause of violence, discrimination and **violation of the right to health**
- Stigma can be addressed by the **law** but laws do not necessarily change **social attitudes**
